Everyone at KSOTA has been blown away by the efforts of the students in the **Seesaw challenges**. It has been amazing to see so much participation from the students, their Home Tutors and their families. My apologies that we have gone two weeks without a challenge— but rest assured, there will be a new one coming out on Monday; so keep your eyes peeled! At our assembly, I explained that every time a site enters a challenge, they are put into a draw for the end of term... so keep joining in to be in the running to win an awesome prize!

KSOTA is very excited to be welcoming **Scitech** on **Wednesday 15th June**. Students will have all received sealed Scitech bags in our mail despatch. These bags contain most of the bits and pieces the students will need to complete their on-air incursion with Scitech. Please do not open these bags until the incursion. A letter from Scitech outlining some other resources that you will need to have access to was sent along with the sealed bags, and a copy has been attached to this newsletter for your reference.

Students in **Kindy—Year 3** will be working with the Scitech team from **9:00-10:00**. These students will explore physics through experiments in pressure, density and buoyancy. Students in **Years 4-6** will work with the Scitech team from **10:30-11:30**. Our Upper Primary students will explore the physics behind several day-to-day phenomena and their implications in the wider world through several interactive activities.

All Scitech sessions will be held in the **Muster Room**. In order for the Scitech incursion to be a success, we ask that a Home Tutor is available to the students during the sessions, to assist and support where necessary. Students at the same site and participating in the same session, will need to logon via one computer. Finally, please ensure that school laptops are out of the way for these experiments; they will get messy! We recommend setting up the experiment on a separate surface to the laptop, so the student can still see and hear the instructions without

risking a laptop mishap. Home Tutors are encouraged to take lots of photos of their students participating in the online incursion, and share in the KSOTA classroom on Seesaw.

As a result of the Scitech incursion, **no air-lessons** will be held on Wednesday 15th June. This will be reflected in teacher's weekly programs. This would be the ideal time to catch up on any missed off-air activities, or complete any outstanding Science, HASS and Visual Art lessons.

It's that time of the year again! Teachers are preparing to write **end of semester reports** for all enrolled students. This year, teachers will be supported in this task by taking a 'report writing day'. On this day, offair activities will be set for students and this will be reflected in teacher's weekly programs. To assist our wonderful teachers, I ask that Home Tutors please take the time to upload any outstanding work samples to Seesaw ASAP, so that teachers have the most up-to-date information for grading and comments.

We have had to say goodbye to some more of our friends this term as they moved onto new schools and, in some cases, new states! We were very sad to say farewell to Rory as he started school in Broome, and to Sana and Meluca as they made Queensland their home; they will all be sorely missed and we wish them every success in their new schools. We have also said goodbye to two of our travelling families who have settled in Kununurra and Gawler, South Australia. We wish the Manners and Noonan families the best of luck in their new homes, and trust that they made many beautiful memories while travelling Australia and schooling with KSOTA.
